ANTIBIOTICS AND DELIVERY FOR SLAUGHTER

Retention time following antibiotic treatment must be met to ensure that slaughter pigs do not contain any antibiotic residue

CHECK BEFORE DELIVERY

- Retention times are met for all animals
- Slaughter pigs must not contain any antibiotic residue
- Remember 30 days' retention time on all tetracycline drugs

RULES OF CONDUCT TO PREVENT ERRORS

- Clearly identify and record all treated animals
- If in doubt of retention times, ask your vet
- Make clear agreements with the person in charge of pigs for delivery

IDENTIFICATION OF SOWS

- Place an ankle strap on sows that were treated
- Clearly mark the sow with spray colour or an ear tag
- Clearly mark the sow chart

IDENTIFICATION OF PIGS

- Place a piece of duct tape on the pen or section holding pigs that are treated – note when retention time expires
- Mark the pigs for the entire retention period and record pen number

Remember 30 days' retention time on all tetracycline drugs



Place an ankle strap on sows treated with tetracycline

IF ANTIBIOTIC RESIDUES ARE DETECTED

- No delivery for slaughter until the herd is approved by advisor
- Penalty pursuant to the terms of the slaughterhouse
- All herds owners must take out a product liability insurance
